Commission's Views: The previous years' gap is not allowed by the Commission once the APR for a given year is approved and the resultant gap/ surplus is carried over to the next year.

a Society has submitted a proposal for uniform increase of Tariff of Rs. 1.13 /unit and Hon'ble Commission by their Tariff Order would determine the Rate for the customer. In order not increase distortions/ irrationality in the Tariff, the uniform increase of Tariff proposed by the society. In order to meet the gap of Rs. 38.30 crore, the proposal is submitted to the Hon'ble Commission for increase in Tariff by Rs. 1.13/unit. However during Annual Performance Review, if there is increase in the Power Purchase Cost, there arises the gap in the Revenue Account.
